- E. The project does not extend more than 200 feet over sovereign,
 submerged land or more than 25 percent of the width of
 the waterway, whichever is less.....F

- F. The project does not require dredging or filling to provide access by
 canal, channel, road or any other means.....G

- G. The special manatee construction conditions will be included as
 special conditions of the permit.....*May affect, not likely to adversely affect*
